Carrie Fischer Siegmund was a veteran of Clarke County School District where she began as a social studies teacher at Clarke Central High School and Classic City High School before transitioning to her role as a member of the district's instructional technology team who was instrumental in implementing the 1:1 technology initiative. She later served as the Regional Director of Innovation and Learning Design at Northeast Georgia RESA. With a Master's Degree in Organizational Development from the University of Georgia, Siegmund was a Google Certified Innovator (London, England 2019) and loved to learn, collaborate, grow, and have FUN while doing so. Her passions were centered in combining interdisciplinary learning (STEM/STEAM, project based learning, literacy focused projects) opportunities across content areas that leave the student with a deeper understanding of their role in our world, no matter their age.
